## **Registration:**

## **Camping:**

- Participants are encouraged to stay both nights if your schedule permits.
- Camping will be allowed in the designated grass area outside of Fort Uncomphagre, and will be located near the Lions pavilion.
- All units and individual campers are responsible for bringing personal and unit camping gear.
- Cub Scouts <u>and</u> parents will be allowed to camp either Friday or Saturday night, but will not be allowed to stay both nights due to Scouts BSA Cub Scout camping policy. Parents must camp with their Cub Scouts to be allowed to camp.
- Campfires are not permitted within the designated camping area.

## Food:

- Units and individuals are responsible for meals on Friday night, Saturday morning and night, and Sunday morning.
- Lunch will be provided by the district on Saturday. This includes pulled pork and chicken, macaroni and cheese, roasted potatoes, green beans, rolls, dessert, and a drink. If there are any food allergies, please contact either of the event coordinators for food related accommodations.
- For unit meals campfires are not permitted in the designated camping area, please plan on bringing cook stoves to use.

## What To Bring:

Participants should bring gear that is appropriate for a Scout camp out, a list of appropriate gear can be found in the camping sections of the Scout Handbook. In addition, Scouts/Units will need to bring the following items with them to camporee:

- Uniforms: Field (Class A Shirt) & Activity (Class B T-Shirt)
- Scouts BSA Medical Form Parts A & B
- Face Covering
- Bandana & Walking Stave (For Blind Cane Maze)
- Gloves, long sleeve button-down shirt, & other clothing (For Self-Care Station)

#### Units:

• Extra Tent or Tarp (For group participation in Tent Set-Up Challenge)

### **Medical:**

- Participants are responsible for following all Scouts BSA medical guidelines, as well as all local COVID19 guidelines.
- If participants do not feel well, they should remain at home to ensure public safety.
- Participants are responsible for bringing all required medical forms and information to this event, this ensures that everyone is protected and that professionals have information necessary for providing adequate care.
- Please see Gail Atkinson to get all of your units' medical forms and patches before you leave for home.

- This camporee will provide participants with an educational disability awareness challenge course
- There will be eight (8) stations for participants to enjoy that focus on a wide range of disabilities including vision, hearing, ambulatory, cognitive, self-care, and are geared towards better understanding of Scouts with Special Needs.
