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<u>Step 1)</u> Select which weekend you would like to attend: September 16-17 September 23-24 <u>Step 2)</u> Register online by going to <u>Cub</u> <u>Camp Out - Greater Colorado</u> <u>Council, Boy Scouts of America</u> (scoutingcolorado.org)& selecting the according link. You can also scan the QR codes below to go straight to the registration page.

<u>Step 3</u> Cost of registration is a flat \$30 which covers up to 7 people total.

For an additional \$5 per person, a Chuck Wagon Dinner is available served at Kephart Dining Hall amongst at beautiful sunset. Meals must be purchased no later than <u>5 days prior</u> to the event date.

How to Get to Camp

Most families will be traveling from the Denver Metro area so we will start from the Denver Technology Center (DTC) on I-25. <u>22799 North</u> <u>Elbert Road, Box 97, Elbert, Colorado 80106</u>

- 1) Tavel South until you approach Castle Rock, CO.
- 2) Take Exit 184
- 3) Turn left at stop light to Founders Parkway.
- 4) Take Founders Parkway to traffic light (*Highway 86 intersection*).
- Turn left at stop light onto Highway 86 and follow Highway 86 through Franktown and traffic signal at Parker Road.



- 6) Continue on Highway 86 through Elizabeth until you come to Elbert Highway on your right (just before the town of Kiowa).
- 7) Turn on Elbert Highway and continue through the town of Elbert.
- Turn left (east) into Peaceful Valley Scout Ranch at the 2nd Entrance Gate 1 for Camp Cris Dobbins.

Rotation Schedule

Each Color Group will begin their activities which are defined in this chart. Each Session will rotation in ascending order (1,2,3,4,5,6,7). If you start at Station 7, then you will go to Station 1 next.

Mealtime & Chuck Wagon Dinner

Families will be responsible for providing their own food during the event. We suggest bringing a cooler to store your meals as there will be no where to store food at the Kephart Dining Hall.

A <u>'Chuck Wagon Dinner'</u> is available to each person for additional \$6 per person. Meals must be purchased no later than <u>5 days prior</u> to the event date. If you have any dietary restrictions, please contact Jack.Loats@scouting.org as soon as possible so we can plan accordingly.

Facility & Sleeping Arrangements

Families attending will need to provide their own tents. Each campsite we'll have a pit latrine equipped with a hand washing station, showers & toilets.

There is a Shower House building located near some of the campsites. That is reserved for adults only. Please don't allow youth to utilize the Shower House at any time.



Check-In/ Check-Out Process

Check-In

- 1) Check-In will open at the Headquarters Building on Saturday Morning at 7:00 AM and end at 8:30 AM.
- 2) Every person that is <u>Camping Saturday Night</u> will need to have a complete <u>BSA Medical Health</u> <u>Form Parts A & B</u> which does not require any doctor's signature.

Please note that you will need to provide this physical copy at Check-In. We will keep it so please do not provide us the original. <u>Digital Copies are **NOT** recommended</u>.

- 3) You will be given your Color Group color as well as a schedule & map.
- 4) Then you will be shown to your campsite where you can drop off your camping gear.


All vehicles must be always parked in the Main Parking unless specifically authorized by Camp Management. Equipment can be delivered to the campsites but must return to the Main Parking Area before beginning to set-up your camping equipment.

Check-Out


- 1) Check-Out will open at Your Campsite on Sunday Morning at 8:00 AM and will end at 10:00 AM.
- Every person in each campsite will need to search around their camping area for trash or nonnatural items. Trash bags can be laid on the side of the nearest main road for the Event Staff to pick-up.
- 3) Vehicles will be allowed to travel to the campsites to collect gear. There will be event staff will be placed around to ensure traffic flow is maintained.

- 7) Sunscreen
- 8) Small First Aid Kit
- 9) Ice Cooler for Meal Storage
