The Aquatics Director is responsible for ensuring campers receive a safe, fun and educational aquatic experience.

Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Train, supervise and evaluate direct report staff.
- Evaluate Aquatic Counselors in the middle of the season and at the end of the season.
- Assist in instruction and quality control in all aquatic areas and classes.
- Ensure BSA, Red Cross and State of Colorado rules and regulations are met in the aquatic areas.
- Ensure lifeguards are actively guarding when campers are in the aquatic area.
- Maintain strict discipline and safety at all times.
- Assist in the proper care, usage, storage, and maintenance of all aquatic equipment.
- Classify campers using the BSA swimming test.
- Ensure paperwork in complete, correct and submitted on time.
- Participate in camp-wide activities.
- Assist in the set up and take down of all camp facilities.
- Submit a "closing report" at the end of the season which includes inventories, daily duties and suggestions for improvement the following year.
- Other duties as assigned.

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REQUIRED FOR THE JOB

- Must be able to read, speak and write the English language
- Must be able to work outdoors at an elevation of 9,000+ feet above sea level in varying weather conditions
- Must be 21 years of age or older
- Must be able to pass a background check from the TRAILS database, CBI and the FBI
- Must be able to become a member of the Boy Scouts of America
- Must be able to physically conduct rescue maneuvers and be able to see and respond to emergencies
