- NYLT is a National Council Program, delivered at the Council level
- Uses a standard syllabus, developed with input from local versions
- Reports to TRAINING committee
 - Each course is authorized and approved by the area training chair
- Has one foot on in CAMPING
 - “Summer Camp” with Training Program
- Delivered by volunteers
- Fulfills “fully trained” requirements for youth

Participants should be part of the group, not outside looking in



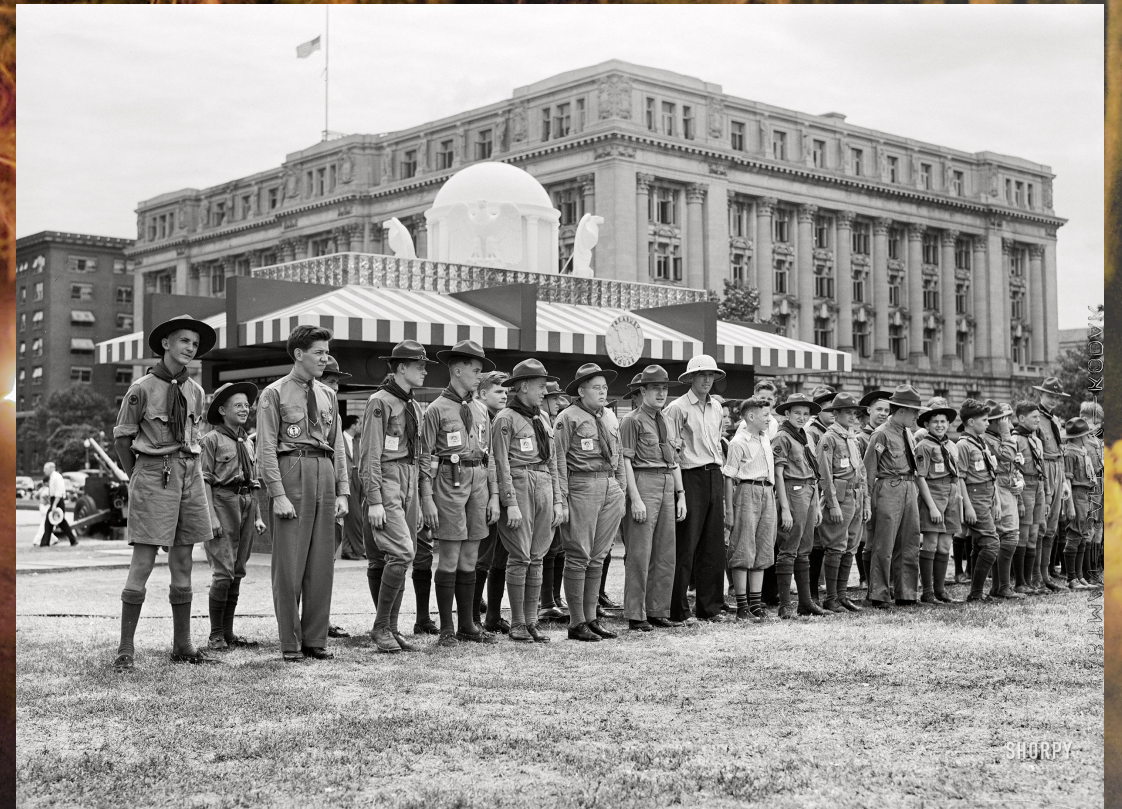
Staff should be more open, embrace EDGE and Servant Leadership



At the end of the week participants should feel part of the troop

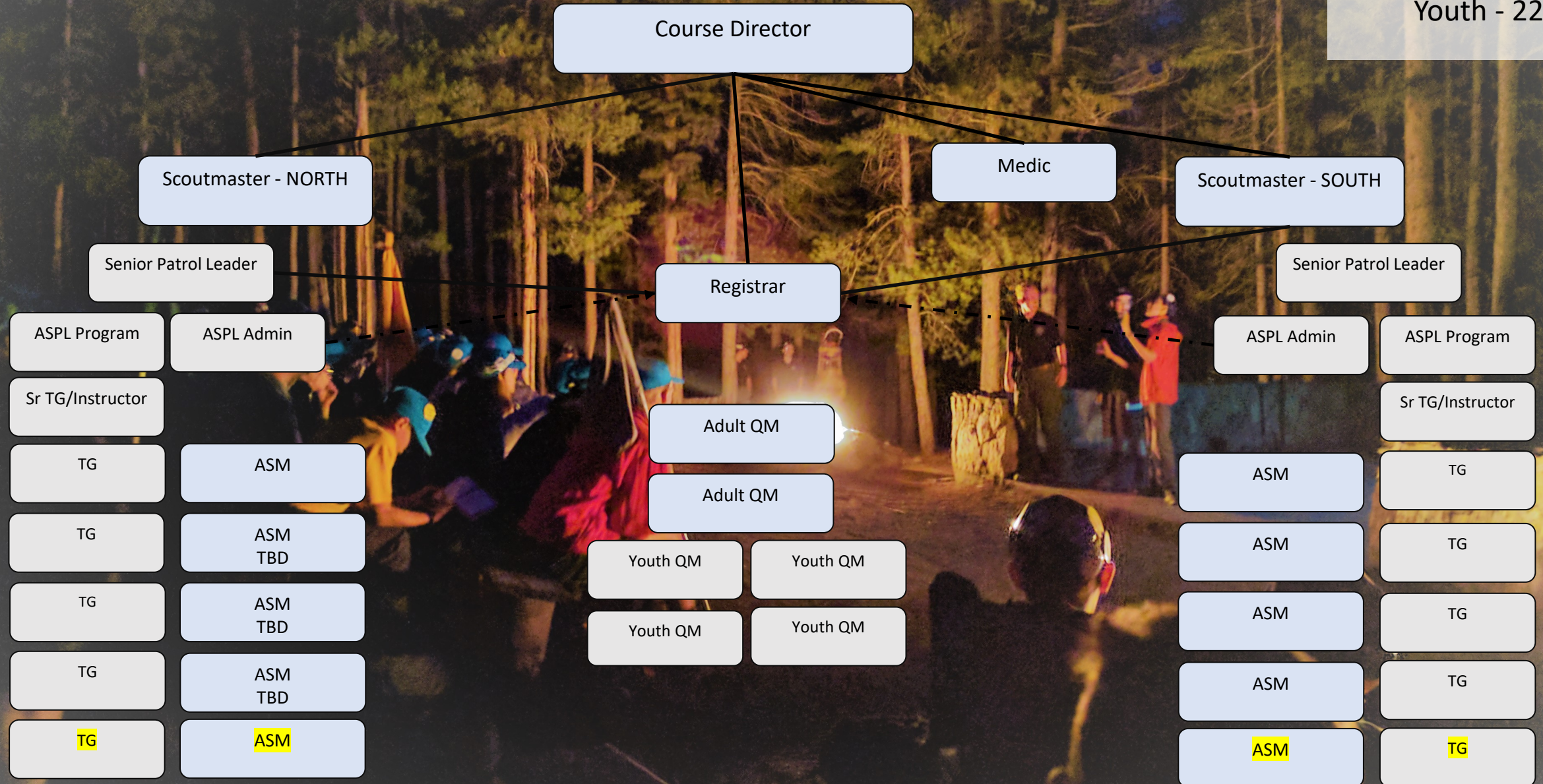
The Two Troop Model

- Consistent across all 5 course weeks
- Two Troops, Five Patrols
 - 60 participants per week
- Course Director manages “meadow wide” team
- Each Troop focuses on program for their 5 patrols



NYLT 2020 Org Chart

Total Staff – 39
Adult – 17
Youth – 22



Changes in 2020

- Price increase for youth - \$360
- Price increase for staff - \$75
- Each week is limited to 22 youth staff
- Need to meet Workbright and Council training requirements
- Deployment of online med form system – “Camp Doc”

Marketing – recruit 300 participants

- Coordinated with council
 - Primarily driven by the NYLT team
 - Reach out to units that never participated
 - Get the G troops involved
 - Don't ignore our supporters
 - Target the YOUTH and then LEADERS
 - Direct communication, troop visits
 - Social Media
 - New Website – same URL
- ALL are responsible to fill five sessions
 - Answer “WHY” someone should go
 - Different message for different audience
 - Youth appeal to youth
 - What can YOU do to bring a new scout into NYLT in 2020
 - Don Tidwell leading the efforts, with support from the team
